

Transit in Seattle

Frequencies shown are for daytime period. See **Service Guide** for a complete summary of frequencies and days of operation. For service between 1:30-4:30 am see **Night Owl** map.

Frequent Service

Every 15 minutes or better, until 7 pm, Monday to Friday. Most lines offer frequent service later into the night and on weekends. Service is less frequent during other times.

- Link Light Rail** rapid transit every 10 minutes
- RapidRide** limited stop bus for a faster ride every 10-12 minutes
- Frequent Bus** every 10-12 minutes
- Frequent Bus** every 15 minutes
- Regular lines** combine for Frequent Service
- Seattle Streetcar** **SL** **FH** lines
- Seattle Center Monorail** every 10 minutes

Every 20-60 minutes most of the day, with more frequent service on some lines during peak hours



How to Ride

PLAN YOUR TRIP
The maps and information in this guide provide an overview of where transit can take you in the city of Seattle and beyond. When you know where you want to go and when, you can also use these handy tools to get you on your way.

OneBusAway
Real-time arrival information for your bus or train. Get the app or visit pugetsound.onebusaway.org or text "onebus [stop number]" to 41411.

Metro Trip Planner
Schedules and custom step-by-step itineraries. Get the Puget Sound Trip Planner app or visit tripplanner.kingcounty.gov.

Transit Alerts
Metro and Sound Transit offer an alert subscription service. You choose the information you want and they will e-mail or text it to you. Sign up online.

CATCH YOUR BUS AT THE STOP

- Identify your bus stop by finding your route on the sign.
- Wait in a visible location near the bus stop sign.
- As bus approaches, check its front sign to confirm it is the correct route and direction.
- Have your fare ready to pay upon entering.
- If you need time to get seated, ask the driver to wait.



CATCH YOUR TRAIN AT THE STATION

- Purchase ticket or tap your ORCA card before boarding.
- Use maps and signs to identify the platform for the direction you are traveling.

GET ON BOARD AND ENJOY THE RIDE

- Please let riders exit the bus or train before boarding.
- Keep your belongings off seats to make room for others.
- If standing, move towards the rear or away from doors.
- The next stop is announced audibly and displayed on interior signs. After the bus/streetcar has left the previous stop, pull the cord by the window or press the button/ yellow strip to request your stop. Link light rail trains stop at every station automatically.
- When possible, exit the bus through rear doors.
- After exiting a Link or Sounder train, don't forget to tap your ORCA card again to ensure you get charged the correct fare.

Metro drivers are the friendliest of any big city transit agency in the country! Feel free to ask them any questions, keeping in mind that they need to focus on driving safely and may not be able to help you. If you have a particularly good experience with your driver, send in a commendation to metro.kingcounty.gov/fanmail.

STROLLERS

Strollers may either be clamped or folded and stowed. People in wheelchairs have priority in the clamp-down area.

BICYCLES

All Metro buses can carry three bicycles on front racks. For your safety, tell the driver before stepping in front of the bus. Load and secure your bike. If rack is full, you must wait for the next bus. When exiting, tell driver that you are removing your bike. On streetcars/trains, put your bike in the rack or stand with it in designated areas. Do not block the door or aisle with your bike.



Service Guide to Transit within Seattle

This guide provides a general overview of service frequency and availability on transit routes/lines operating within the city of Seattle. Hours and days of operation will vary. Consult timetables for more details.

Not all suburban service is shown. Custom/school service is not shown.

Peaks are 6–9 am and 3–6 pm weekdays.
Day is 5 am to 7 pm, excluding peaks.
Evening is 7–10 pm.
Night is 10 pm to end of regular service, typically midnight–1:30 am.
Owl service is between 1:30–4:30 am. See Night Owl map for route details.

Most lines originate in downtown Seattle; only their original destination is shown. End points of lines in other areas or passing through downtown are indicated.
